Dear Judges, Clerks, Bailiffs, Warrant Officers, Prosecutors, and Court Personnel:

Working in a municipal court is rewarding, but holds challenges as well. The Office of Court Administration's 2010 report states that over 7.5 million cases were filed through Texas Municipal Courts. Revenues totaled over \$746 million dollars and there were 1,500 municipal judges, making them the state's largest group of judges. Within this same group we have a diversity of city courts ranging in populations from 100 to 2 million people, both non-attorney and attorney judges, and courts of record and non-record. There are municipal courts where the clerk is the Judge and cities that have multiple municipal judges. Our municipal courts throughout Texas are truly unique and as varied as the state's landscape.
